Paycheck Protection Program Loan Application & Information

The US Dept. of Treasury has just released the loan application for the 7(a) Paycheck Protection Program we told you about in our email on Saturday, March 28. The link below contains the form itself as well as instructions for completing it. Once completed, it is to be submitted to your SBA Participating Lender.

Please note the calculation for the average monthly payroll on page 3 of the application. We will be happy to assist you with this information. Also note that small businesses and sole proprietorships will be able to apply beginning April 3 through an existing SBA lender. Beginning April 10, independent contractors and self-employed individuals can apply for loans through an existing SBA lender as well.
